### How to get started

## Fees for some IDs/licenses have increased







New prices went into effect Oct. 1, 2022

In addition to the enhanced license/ID fee, a couple other fee increases took effect on Oct. 1st. **Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5974** also raises:

### **Driver Abstract Fee**

\$15

A driver abstract is a summary of a person's driving record that is often used by employers or prospective employers, data brokers, volunteer organizations, insurance carriers, alcohol and drug assessment or treatment agencies, or other entities. The cost increased from \$13 to \$15 on Oct.1, 2022, and then will increase to \$17 on July 1, 2029.

### License/ID card replacement

\$20

Driver license photo and update-only fee: This covers a replacement license or ID card to correct or update information, such as obtaining a new photo or updating an address.

## FEE INCREASE WILL HELP FUND STATE TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS

As of October 1, 2022, the cost of enhanced Washington licenses and IDs increased by \$3 per year. That means a six-year license/ID will cost \$18 more, and an eight-year version will cost \$24 more.

The fee increase will help fund **Move Ahead Washington**, the nearly \$17 billion transportation package signed into law earlier this year. As part of the same law, **other fee increases** — such as those for original license plates — took effect July 1, 2022.

### Traveling out of state next summer?

By this time next year, a standard driver license or ID card won't get you through airport security. If you plan to fly – or if you plan to drive to Canada or Mexico – you'll need to upgrade to an enhanced license/ID (EDL/EID) or consider one of **several other options**.

Washington residents seeking an enhanced license/ID are advised not to delay. As demand increases, it could become harder to **find an appointment** at your nearest driver licensing office. The soonest available appointment may be several weeks out.

### Things you can do:



- Spread facts, not fears. REAL ID only affects those who plan to fly, or enter certain federal facilities, or travel to Canada or Mexico by land or by sea. Your standard driver license or standard ID card will still be valid after May 2023.

You must have a motorcycle permit or endorsement on your driver

license to legally operate a motorcycle on Washington State roadways.

### MOTORCYCLE OPERATOR MANUAL, TEST MATERIALS NOW AVAILABLE IN SEVEN LANGUAGES

The State's Motorcycle Operator Manual is now available online in Chinese, Korean, Russian, Spanish, Tagalog, and Vietnamese. This will be of help to anyone who wants to get a motorcycle permit and endorsement but worries they may not pass the test in English.

The manual is produced by the Washington Motorcycle Safety Program at the Department of Licensing. English and Spanish versions are available in physical form at some **driver licensing offices** and **motorcycle training/testing sites**.

DOL's outreach team has been busy with community events after a two-year pause. Following are some of the in-person

- The Latino Expo 2022, hosted by the Latino Educational Training Institute, City of Lynnwood, and Edmonds College. This event brought the community together to celebrate the Latino culture and provided access to information and local resources. Everyone enjoyed the live music and delicious Latin food!
- The Neighborhood House of Seattle, in collaboration with the Seattle Housing Authority, King County Housing Authority, Somali Health Board, and other partners, implemented five Back to School, and Community Resource Health Fairs throughout August. Resources were available to address the needs of our lowincome community members, public housing residents, immigrants, and refugees. Most questions we received were about obtaining a driver license and how REAL ID may impact them.
- The Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic hosted multiple health and resource fairs throughout Eastern Washington, including Wapato, Prosser, Yakima, and Spokane. More than 25 organizations participated with resource tables providing access to free immunizations, food, and many other resources.
- Vancouver's Saturday in the Park Pride event was well attended. The event brought together communities from throughout Southwest Washington to celebrate the lives and history of the LGBTQAI+ community. We also participated in El Centro de la Raza's Latinx Pride event where everyone was invited to celebrate LGBTQAI+ and Latino/a/x identities.

Also, a big shout out to the 2022 Hope Festival at the Seattle Center in July. This event served 700+ individuals experiencing poverty and homelessness from across the greater Seattle area. The event, planned and executed entirely by local high school students, provided many critical resources including - hope!
